Directions:

From the North

Go to I 64 / 40 (E-W);
from I 64 40, South on Big Bend
Left (S) on Laclede Station Road
(continued below)

From the East

Go West on I-44; Take Shrewsbury Exit,
turn Right / South at the end of ramp;
(at 4th corner) Right on Murdoch
Left (S) on Laclede Station Road
(continued below)

From the West or South

Go East on I-44 (NE)
South on Laclede Station Rd.
(continued below)

Continuing From Laclede Station Road:

When sign above marks a lane for “Heege
Rd only”, get in far left turn lane.
South on Laclede Station Road
At corner (Jack in the Box), Left on Watson
Road. Go about 1 mile (past Rothman
Furniture.) On Left, sign on brick walls:
Cardinal Ritter Senior Services – enter
there, drive in straight ahead. Follow
signs (L, then R) for Mother of
Perpetual Help Residence, to Lally Room.
Covered entrance to R – sign in at reception
Desk. Lally Room is on the Lower Level.

Brother William Short, OFM is a Franciscan friar, former president and academic dean of the Franciscan School of Theology in Berkeley. He is currently professor of Christian Spirituality at the Graduate Theological Union and the director of the St. Francis Retreat Center in California.

With special love of things medieval, he is a scholar equally comfortable in the fields of spirituality, Christian history, and the Franciscan tradition. He researches, writes, lectures, and translates in four languages. He is co-editor of the three volume series of the English translation of all the documents written by St. Francis of Assisi, and has published works on the history of the Franciscan movement.
