Addressed the grave issues of Human Rights Violations in Columbia, of Ex-President Ernesto Samper and some direct and indirect agents of his government, for their active and passive responsibility for more than two hundred crimes against humanity perpetrated in the Uraba region in 1997 and 1998. The Federation became a sponsor of the criminal complaint and encouraged its members to become educated about the situation in Colombia. <hr/> Affirmed the call to continue our three-year efforts to close the School of the Americas (renamed the Defense Institute of Hemispheric Cooperation) by encouraging member congregations to pray, write letters, participate in campaigns and rallies, and do all in our power to close the SOA, collaborating with other groups wherever possible.
